Letter of Introduction to Host Family

Student Code of Conduct

Our aim is to ensure that every student has a safe, enjoyable and academically beneficial experience in Ireland.

For this reason, it is important to set out what is expected of the student while studying in Ireland and the standards of conduct that all students are expected to adhere to in school, in the host family and all other occasions.

Local Coordinator

Each student is assigned a designated local coordinator whose role is to look after their day to day needs during their stay in Ireland.

Students therefore should:

- keep in regular contact with their coordinator and be accessible to phone calls or visits.
- ensure that their mobile phone is in credit at all times so that they can contact their coordinator in the case of an emergency
- contact their local coordinator immediately if there are any difficulties in school, host family or any other area

Please remember that you can talk to your coordinator in confidence if you have any personal or domestic concerns during your stay in Ireland.

Host Family

Living with a host family is an integral part of the experience and it is essential that students adapt well to life in the household.

Students should:

- maintain a positive attitude and integrate with the host family
- be respectful to the family members and their property at all times
- offer to help with the household duties and keep their room tidy and clean
- respect meal times and inform their host family in advance if they will be late for, or do not require, dinner
- socialise with the host family in the evenings and at the weekends and don't retreat for long periods of time to the bedroom
- accompany the host family on outings and family occasions, where possible.
- respect any house rules. This point is very important as persistent failure to do so will inevitably cause tensions in the family environment and may ultimately make their position in the family untenable.

Any issues or difficulties with the routine or house rules in the host family should be discussed with your coordinator as soon as possible to avoid an uncomfortable or untenable situation developing.

School

All schools have rules and guidelines governing student behaviour. Students need to be aware of these rules and school policies including timetables, uniforms, books, late arrivals, absenteeism and disciplinary procedures. These should be detailed in the homework journal / student diary. If not the coordinator or school staff can provide the particulars.

To ensure a positive experience in school students should:

- be proactive in their approach to school and be motivated to study
- become involved in extracurricular activities such as sport, drama, debating, choir or other interests
- make an effort to integrate with other students and participate actively in class
- complete homework as required
- respect teachers and school staff at all times and avoid behaviour that may be seen as insolent, confrontational or impolite
- treat other students with respect
- remember that each student is responsible for their own behaviour in school

Non adherence to school policies or behaviour that interrupts or diminishes the normal progress of school is a serious matter and will result in disciplinary action by the school authorities. Such action typically take the form of detention, suspension from classes and, in extreme cases expulsion from the school.

Failure to attend school, leaving the school premises during designated school times or being consistently late for class are serious issues which are subject to disciplinary action by the school authorities.

Absences from school are normally allowed in special circumstances and must be arranged in advance. In the case of illness the school must be informed at the earliest possible time.

Parents are responsible for any additional costs arising from school disciplinary actions. In the case of expulsion from the school students will be required to return home to their parents immediately. This is at the parents' expense and there can be no reduction/refund of fees.

Social Media

The use of the internet, cameras or mobile phones whether personal, school or host family property to record, copy or transmit material that is illegal, defamatory, obscene, pornographic, hateful or has the effect of, or is intended to harass, intimidate or discriminate against any other person, constitutes a serious breach of the Code of Conduct and will be treated accordingly.

Students should pay particular attention to and comply with school rules regarding the use of phones and social media.

Photographs or videos should not be taken within the confines of the host family without the express permission of the family.

Illegal/Antisocial Behaviour

The possession and use of alcohol or illegal substances/drugs, theft or causing damage to property and antisocial behaviour are strictly prohibited. These illegal activities frequently involve the police and are grounds for immediate removal from the programme and repatriation home. The use of alcohol is also strictly prohibited for those students over the age of 18 on Ireland's Programmes.

Inappropriate sexual behaviour by minors is also against the law and will have similar consequences.

Parents are responsible for any additional costs arising in such circumstances and there can be no reduction/refund of fees.

Student Curfews

Students' safety and well-being is of paramount importance and means that there are restrictions on the times students spend outside of the family or school environment.

- Students should not go out during the week (Monday – Thursday) after dinner time except to attend prearranged activities or school related events.
- Students are not permitted to remain in the city centre after 18:00 at any time.
- At weekends please ensure that you have a Bus/DART/LUAS organised to allow enough time to get home before the deadline.
- Under no circumstances are students allowed to congregate in public parks after 18:00
- Weekend curfews (Friday – Sunday) are as follows:

Under 14 years of age:	20:00.
Under 16 years of age:	21:00.
Under & Over 18 years of age:	22:00.
- Extensions to the curfew times are only permitted in special circumstances which must be pre-arranged with the coordinator
- Staff and coordinators are the people on the ground with the local experience and parents must respect and not undermine or seek to overrule any decisions regarding social activities. Please remember that these decisions are always taken in the best interests of the student

Failure to adhere to the curfew times is a serious breach of the code of conduct and will result in the application of the disciplinary process.

Coronavirus Guidelines

All students are expected to abide to Government Guidelines around Coronavirus. Students should familiarise themselves with the current guidelines. If a student has any questions about Coronavirus they can ask their student coordinator. The breaking of Government Guidelines extremely serious. Any student who consistently breaks these guidelines will be seen to be in serious breach of the Code of Conduct and will be treated accordingly.

Disciplinary Procedures

The Code of Conduct is an integral and essential element to ensuring the safety and well-being of students while in Ireland. Non-compliance with the Code therefore is a serious matter and will result in the following graduated series of actions. Steps may be skipped depending on the nature and seriousness of the breach:

- Step 1. Discussion/Verbal warning by student's local coordinator
- Step 2. Attending a formal meeting at head office which will clearly set out the relevant issues, provide an opportunity for the student to respond and agree on an appropriate course of action to address and prevent a recurrence of the issues. Parents will be advised in writing of the details and outcome of such meeting
- Step 3. Receive a written warning detailing the issues involved and the corrective action required. Parents will receive a copy of the warning.
- Step 4. Suspension which could entail being sent home for a period of time
- Step 5. Removal from the programme and repatriation home

Parents are responsible for any additional costs arising from the disciplinary process. In the event of a student being removed from the programme there is no reduction/refund of fees.



Neck Measurement:

When you are taking the neck measurement, leave 2 fingers between the tape and the skin. This will ensure that when the top button is fastened, that the collar is not too tight.

Chest Measurement:

Measure around the fullest part of the chest, making sure that the tape is level under the arms and across the shoulder blades. Make sure that your child is relaxed when measured so that you get a true measurement.

Waist Measurement:

Measure around the waist at the natural waistline (smallest part). In younger children this is usually midway between the bottom rib and hip bone.

Inside Leg:

When measuring, make sure you are stood up straight with shoes on. Measure from the top of the leg (inside near to the crotch area) down to where you want the trousers to finish. This is usually 1 inch from the ground.
